2025-2026

A THREE-YEAR PROGRAM THAT TRAINS PEOPLE TO BE DIRECTORS OF THE SPIRITUAL EXERCISES OF SAINT IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA

The Pierre Favre program is a three-year training program to give the *Spiritual Exercises* of St. Ignatius of Loyola. The program is named after St. Pierre Favre who was recently canonized by Pope Francis. Often called the "Second Jesuit," Pierre Favre was a close friend of St. Ignatius of Loyola and St. Francis Xavier, and the man who Ignatius said could best direct people through the *Spiritual Exercises*.

How The Program Works

The program provides an in-depth learning of the *Spiritual Exercises* that combines critical examination of the text of the *Spiritual Exercises* and other Ignatian writings, experiential reflection, and a practicum in giving the *Spiritual Exercises*. Participants will become highly familiar with the *Exercises* and will be able to competently give the *Spiritual Exercises* in its various forms by the time they graduate from the program.

Each year has its own focus and dynamic that contributes to the integrated vision of the training program.

Year One

The first year focuses on the life and legacy of St. Ignatius of Loyola, an introductory survey of Ignatian spirituality, and a careful analysis of the text and reading of commentaries on the *Spiritual Exercises*. The purpose of this year is to provide students with a solid foundation of the *Spiritual Exercises*, serve as a means of personal spiritual growth, and serve in preparation for directing the *Spiritual Exercises*.

Year Two

The second year focuses on integrating the learning of the first year with a deepening critical reflection of one's experience of the *Spiritual Exercises*, with the aim of preparing the participants to effectively give the *Spiritual Exercises* in their third year. They will gain practical insights into directing the *Spiritual Exercises*, learn the structure and dynamics of the *Exercises*, spiritual accompaniment, discernment, and practical applications.

Year Three

The goal of the third year of the Pierre Favre Program is to equip and assist students in their giving the 19th Annotation Retreat of the *Spiritual Exercises*. Through seminars, reflection, and supervision, participants learn how to listen in a helpful way to the activity of God in the prayer of those whom they direct. Classes will combine theory and practical application to the practice of directing the 19th Annotation Retreat through presentations, group discussion, role plays, case studies, and journal exercises.

Schedule

Classes are held at The Jesuit Retreat Center of Los Altos two Sunday afternoons each month during the academic year, starting in mid-September and ending in mid-May. Classes are normally from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.

Prerequisites for the program

Participants are expected to have made the full *Spiritual Exercises* of St. Ignatius, individually directed, either in the 30-day or 19th Annotation format. They should be in ongoing spiritual direction with a director familiar with the Ignatian tradition.

Cost

Tuition is \$1,800 per year.

This includes textbooks, instructions, handouts, and meals.
